- 5'000 copies pressed, sold out by September 1979.

Facus 2 UK

- Released October 1980 as per Record Business.
- Domestic UK pressings apparently were 25p cheaper per copy than the US imports of which several thousands were sold.

Fac 5

- Released May 1979 as per Shareholder's Analysis and Factory May 1979 newsletter.
- 1'000 and 4'000 copies pressed, sold out by June 1980.

Fac 6

- Released May 1979 as per Record Business and Factory May 1979 newsletter.
- 5'000 copies pressed, sold out by September 1979.

- Released June 1979. Sold out by October 1979.
- First pressing of 10'000 copies in textured Garrod + Lofthouse sleeve. Pressed by WEA (West Drayton) and <u>not</u> red translucent. Matrix: Side A: FACT-10 - OUTSIDE ! B → THIS IS THE WAY A PORKY PRIME CUT
 Side B: FACT 10 - INSIDE ! A A PORKY PRIME CUT → STEP
- Second pressing of 10'000 copies in textured G+L sleeve. Pressed by WEA, <u>not</u> translucent. Pressed November 1979. Sold out by mid of 1980. Matrix is the same but with higher stamper numbers, e.g. S-11, S-6, etc.

- Sleeve colours and pressing quantities as per Shareholder's Analysis July 1980.

- The cassettes are either black with light grey paper labels or light grey with dark grey paper labels.
- The boxed cassette was released in December 1985 as per Music Week.

- For both pressings exist white label test pressings.

- The 7" was released in June 1980 as per Record Business.
- 3'000 pressed by WEA and sold out by July 1980.
- The 12" was released in December 1980 as per Music Week.

- Released in October 1980 as per Music Week.
- There are 4 versions: 2 pressed by Tranco (Mitcham), and 2 pressed by WEA (West Drayton):

- 25.000 copies of first batch sold by July. 25.000 of second batch (September), 25.000 of third batch (November 1980), to be given away free.
- Untitled third track: 'As You Said'.
- The green flexi 7" is a fake. Has been heavily discussed in the Joy Division community and forums.

Fac 29

• Released in February 1981, as per Music Week.

- Released December 1980 (as per advert in NME from 20.12.1980).
- Never released in purple pouch (or for Tony Wilson only?) but in black wallet only.
- First edition in gold cassette shell and X-mas card with 'From the city that brought you "Strangeways". Seasonal Greetings and a seasoned cassette. Love, Factory.'
- Second edition in white or grey cassette shells. No cards.
- 5'000 copies in total.

• Released in February 1981, as per Music Week and NME review.

- First announced for October 1980 but released in December 1980, as per Record Business and a Record Mirror review.
